### **SHOW RULES**

1. Entrance is free and open to all
2. All floral and vegetable exhibits except in the Floral Art and arrangement classes must be grown by the exhibitor. All exhibits must be the work of the exhibitor.
3. Exhibitors may stage their exhibits as they please within the allocated space. Staging is between 8.30am and 10.30am .
4. No person may enter more than one exhibit per class.
5. The decision of the Judges shall be final on matters of merit but the Stewards appointed by the Committee shall decide on eligibility of entries. Prize cards and trophies may be withheld if in the opinion of the Judge exhibits are not of sufficient merit.
6. Points will be awarded towards trophies as follows:  
1<sup>st</sup> place – 3 points, 2<sup>nd</sup> place – 2 points, 3<sup>rd</sup> place – 1 point.  
In the "collections" classes these will be doubled to 6, 4 and 2
7. The Show opens to the public at 2.30pm and trophies will be awarded between 3.30 and 4pm.

**ENTRY FORMS** must be for individuals only and should reach the Show Secretary on the Tuesday before the Show at latest. They may be left at the Rackenford Shop, or a list of classes entered can be sent to Frances Kelland at [frankelland@hotmail.co.uk](mailto:frankelland@hotmail.co.uk).
