

## Spring Show Trophies

**The Tunnel Inn Trophy** for the highest aggregate overall

**The Daisy Singerton Trophy** for the most points in the Narcissi classes.

**The Shovelton Trophy** for the best exhibit in the show

**The Backstone Junior Cup** for the highest aggregate in the children's section 5 to 7 years

**The Backstone Senior Cup** for the highest aggregate in the children's Section 8-13 years

## RHS Definitions of Narcissi

**Trumpet.** Usually solitary flowers: each have a trumpet that is as long as or longer than, the petals.

**Large cupped.** Solitary flowers that have a cup at least one third the length of, but shorter than, the petals.

**Small cupped.** Flowers are often born singly; each has a cup of not more than one third the length of the petals.

**Double.** These appear to have no trumpet at all but have several flounced rings of petals.

**Multi-headed.** These have more than one flower per stem.

## SHOW RULES

1. Entrance is free and open to all
2. All floral and vegetable exhibits except in the Floral Art and arrangement classes must be grown by the exhibitor. All exhibits must be the work of the exhibitor.
3. Exhibitors may stage their exhibits as they please within the allocated space. Staging is between 9 am and 11 am on the day of the Show. The Show will then close for judging and reopen for public viewing at 2.30pm. Trophies will be awarded at 3.30 pm after which exhibits may be removed.
4. No person may enter more than one exhibit per class
5. The decision of the Judges shall be final on matters of merit but the Stewards appointed by the Committee shall decide on eligibility of entries. Prize cards and trophies may be withheld if in the opinion of the Judge exhibits are not of sufficient merit.

ENTRY FORMS must be for individuals only and should reach the Show Secretary on the Tuesday before the Show at latest.

## **Cut Flowers**

### **Narcissi**

1. 3 blooms, trumpet variety
2. 3 blooms, large cupped
3. 3 blooms, small cupped
4. 6 blooms, trumpet – 3 each of 2 varieties
5. 3 stems, multi-headed
6. 3 stems, double blooms
7. 7 stems, mixed varieties, all different
8. 1 specimen bloom
9. 1 vase of 6 stems, miniature daffodils, mixed

### **Tulips**

10. 1 vase, 3 blooms, dwarf
11. 1 vase, 3 blooms, one colour (not dwarf)
12. 1 vase, 5 blooms, all different varieties

### **Miscellaneous**

13. 1 vase, 5 stems, polyanthus, mixed
14. 1 vase, 5 stems, wallflowers, any colours
15. A vase of spring flowers
16. A container of polyanthus, growing or cut, max 9" diameter
17. A single stem of a flowering shrub
18. A selection of rockery flowers; max 4" across

### **Shrubs**

19. 1 vase, 3 varieties of shrubs grown principally for their flowers (at least in bud)
20. 1 vase, 3 varieties of shrubs grown principally for their foliage
21. A bowl of heathers, bowl up to 6" diameter

## **Pot Plants**

*All in maximum pot size of 12" diameter*

22. 1 pot/bowl of growing bulbs
23. 1 pot/bowl of growing narcissus
24. A hippeastrum(amaryllis)
25. A pelargonium (geranium)
26. A cactus or succulent
27. A pot grown orchid
28. A pot plant grown principally for its flowers and not mentioned above
29. A pot plant grown principally for its foliage

## **Floral Art**

*Any height is allowed, space limit 24" square. Accessories allowed.*

30. An arrangement in white and yellow
31. An arrangement including feathers
32. A miniature collection
